Brief History of the American Zither Verband

THE IDEA of forming a National Zither players organization was first conceived by A. W. Schepf of Kansas City. He unfolded his plan to Mr. F. W. Mehl of Kansas City and Mr. H. C. Grohe of Washington, Mo. While these gentlemen thought it a splendid scheme, yet they feared that the plan could not be carried out successfully in so large a country as ours, without much labor. It was decided to get into communication with some of the best known and most enthusiastic Zither players, for the purpose of making their acquaintance and establishing a regular correspondence, thereby mutually creating Zither-enthusiasm. These gentlemen were in turn requested to write to their own Zither-acquaintances and thus establish an endless chain correspondence. The gentlemen who took to this idea with enthusiasm are Max Mayer of St. Paul, A. K. Fahrner of Davenport and F. Lueder of Peoria, Ills., and much of the success thus far obtained is due to the valiant work of these men. It must not be forgotten however, that Messrs. Mehl, Grohe and Schepf were by no means idle, but did heroic work to get things under way. The plan at this time was to gather with a few of the most enthusiastic Zitherists during the fall of 1912 and talk the matter over. Things however developed so rap-

idly, that it was deemed advisable to issue invitations and call a general meeting of Zither players for the purpose of effecting an organization. All those who attended this gathering, will never forget the pleasure and enthusiasm which pervaded the First American Zither Congress at Washington, Mo., Sept. 2nd, 3rd and 4th of last year.

The American Zither Verband was born at this Congress and the officers chosen were: A. W. Schepf, president, A. K. Fahrner and Miss B. H. Keller, vice presidents, F. W. Mehl, secretary, H. R. Herschel, treasurer, and A. K. Fahrner, musical director. In the nine months of its existence the Verband has nearly trebled its membership, thanks to the untiring efforts of its officers, and especially those of Mr. F. W. Mehl, its secretary. Mr. Fahrner's thorough musical knowledge and vim is bound to lead the A. Z. V. to a high musical plane.

The permanency of the organization is established and it is only a question of time until its membership will run into the thousands and the A. Z. V. will be known by every Zither player in the world. To bring about this desired result every member should catch some of the enthusiasm of the officers and constitute himself a missionary in the cause of our beloved Zither.

Bringing with a hundred voices, joy to everything.







Franz Schwarzer, whose activities as a Zither builder exerted perhaps the greatest influence upon affairs pertaining to the Zither in America, was born in Olmütz, Moravia, in 1828. He received his early education in the Public Schools and Gymnasium (High School) of that city, and later augmented it at the Polytechnic Institute in Vienna, where he studied and learned the principals of wood carving, ornamentation and architecture. After his return from College he received instruction on the Zither from the celebrated composer Ludwig Ritter von Dietrich. Having mastered the instrument, he began to study the principles involved in its construction. In 1864 Mr. Schwarzer emigrated to America and in 1866 settled in Washington, D. C., where he soon built his first Zither. The high quality of his Zithers soon won him fame and made the rapid development of his Zither industry possible. Schwarzer Zithers are known and played all over the world. On February 24, 1904, at the age of 76 and at the conclusion of a most successful and useful career, Mr. Schwarzer departed from this life. All who knew him, cherish his memory.

Mrs. Josephine Schwarzer, wife of Franz Schwarzer, the famous Zither manufacturer, was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Pettera of Brünn, Moravia, in which city she was born, in 1835. She was Mr. Schwarzer's constant and helpful companion during his long and useful life, and contributed much to the eminent success which he attained in his business. After Mr. Schwarzer's demise she continued in the business, which her husband had established, until her death, which occurred at Washington, Missouri, on October 22nd, 1912. Her beautiful character and innumerable kind deeds will ever be remembered by those who knew her.

Mr. Herman C. Grolie is the present owner and manager of the Schwarzer Zither industry and is conducting the same in a most efficient and successful manner.






WHEN the days of the Second Congress of the American Zither Verband are here the Davenport Zither Club will have been in existance over thirty years. The organization—like all others—has had its ups and downs. There were times when nothing could be more harmonious than the gatherings of the little band of enthusiasts. Whether these gatherings were at the home of one or another, just to have a good time or upon other occasions—it made no difference—the little band was there and stirring things up: “wir brachten Leben in die Bude.” Little did we think of organizing. We simply agreed to come together somewhere, and wherever we went our Zithers went with us. Not for some years did anyone aule to the organization of a club and then it came about rather accidentally. A number of patrons agreed to get up an entertainment for the benefit of the Kindergarten, then in need of funds.

So one evening our old friends Hy. Sonntag, A. K. Fahrner (still in his teens) and Wm. Reuter wended their way to the home of Mr. Rohlfs, which may rightly be called the cradle of the Davenport Zither Club. We shall never forget how we were received by the host and Miss Speiser, then governess of the grand-daughter of Mr. Rohlfs, as hostess. We talked, sang and played. The “Glühwein” and other refreshments tuned us up all right. It was agreed that we should have rehearsals. Some music was purchased, including such numbers as the “Verlobungsfest Marsch,” “Die Rosenheimer,” “Club March” by Steiner, etc. When the “Club March” was played the young lady wondered what club might be meant. Well that was the signal—the cue, so to speak—for the organization of the Zither Club. Our début being very successful we had no difficulty in getting a guitar player, a violinist and gradually as pupils were maturing, additional Zither players. It may be stated here, that with little exception all who ever played in the club were home product, i. e. learned to play in Davenport and were mostly pupils of Mr. Fahrner.

We grew some, but not as strong as one should think considering that we played in concert, with fifty or more instruments. It would be difficult to determine just what prevented players from becoming members. Most of them






consider themselves too young to join a club of older people. The advent of the piano and the seeming greater possibilities with less effort was another set-back. Then with increasing other obligations of those who used to be here, there and everywhere with their instruments—the best means of propaganda was lost. It is sad but true, this is a more material age; the great mass of those who contemplate learning to play an instrument are prompted by the possibility of earning money on the side. The younger generation has not that turn of mind; they lack the disposition for anything that requires what we of German descent call "Gemüth." It is to be regretted, but alas! It is so. Our club was not spared its dark days. Quarrels and squabbles arose and there was discord which ushered in a period of stagnation. Those who endured, proved by their action, that the good cause was at heart. For a time the club was handicapped for want of a home. We were continually wandering from home to home and with this a laxity of discipline set in—the social part of the evening absorbing our energies to such an extent that it was quite detrimental to our progress. All this has been overcome. We mention with pride the concerts of the past, when under the able leadership of our worthy director Mr. A. K. Fahrner, we played to capacity houses and gathered laurels in abundance. In 1903 our director left Davenport to make his home in California. Mr. Wm. Wagner kindly consented to lead us and deserves credit for his efforts with us. We surely always had a good time—too good a time—and did the best we could under the conditions.

When Mr. Fahrner returned after an absence of six years we were more than delighted. He began to discipline us again. Although we sometimes think it hard and too much like work, we cheerfully submit and find him just as jolly as the rest of the bunch, as soon as the hour of practice is over. It would occupy too much space in this booklet to go more into details in regard to the various undertakings of the Davenport Zither Club, let it suffice, that many are the pleasant remembrances in connection therewith.
