This is the first edition of The Zither Newsletter. The purpose of the Newsletter is to provide a medium for communicating informative items of interest to zither players. Hopefully, the Newsletter can be published monthly. As a beginning it is anticipated a quarterly edition will be published until the Newsletter gets properly organized. It is hoped that this Newsletter will gain the support of zither instructors and players, as well as all friends of the zither. The Newsletter's object is to foster and promote the art of zither playing in America. All literary contributions bearing upon zither playing, zither history, zither records and the zither in general will be sincerely appreciated. It is requested that anyone having any news items or articles submit them to the editor. It is only through the contributions of your news items and articles that this Newsletter can succeed.

Hopefully, future Newsletters can contain several pieces of zither music that will be interesting and graded for the varying abilities of zither players. In order to continue publishing the Zither Newsletter your financial support will be requested. The Newsletter is not trying to make a profit. For example, the expenses for this edition for news gathering, editing, typing and publication were paid "out of the Editor's personal pocket" with no thought of recompense. The Newsletter's only purpose is communication of zither news. Readers are asked to comment on a \$4.00 subscription fee (which would not include music) to defray the costs of publication. Applicable advertising would also be welcomed. It is also requested that any member who has access to a printing press (ditto or multilith) submit quotes for a Newsletter containing 6 pages of text and 2 pages of music: 100 copies to be published monthly.
